

From the desk of: William F. Thompson, Superintendent

The three (3) weeks between the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays is a shorter period than normal this year. It only intensifies the already busy schedule of activities and events for students and faculty. Activities, games and concerts are packed into this busy period. Secondary students will be busy studying and preparing for semester exams as the first academic semester is scheduled to end on Friday, December 19th. As you will note on the enclosed school calendar, there are practically no free nights during this three (3) week period.

If this is not enough to occupy their day and evening schedules, there are time demands for family, church, community, job and other responsibilities that can create a busy and hectic lifestyle for students and families. The stress to keep up with all these demands can, and does, have an effect on a student's physical health and mental approach to school. Parents are encouraged to be supportive of their children in working through the demands that activities place upon a child at this time of the year.

Another factor for constant awareness at this time is weather. We encourage families to make plans thoroughly and inform everyone involved when there are considerations for school cancellation: late start, or an early dismissal. In town, if a child lives a long distance from school and is in the lower grades, arrangements might be made with a friend living en-route as a "stop-off" place. Make sure that the parent/guardian is notified if the child stops. In the country, some people with long lanes have asked a neighbor up the road to call them when the bus is coming so they can meet their child. Make arrangements as needed. The ultimate consideration is to **dress students for cold and bad weather.** Should there be a bus breakdown or a bus gets stuck, proper clothing could be a critical matter.

<u>PARENTS:</u> The school day for students at Ponca Elementary begins at **8:25am**. Students are not allowed to enter the building until **8:15.** We have seen some children arrive as early as 7:45 without the proper clothing for this time of year. We would ask that students <u>Not Arrive at School Before 8:10am</u>.

As colder weather approaches, we ask parental cooperation on the following as a measure for student safety. If you choose to drive and drop off your children at school, please do so on the **north side of the elementary building**. The west side of the elementary is **RESERVED** for students getting off and on school buses in the morning and afternoon. We would ask your same consideration when you pick up your child after school.

The Jackson Elementary shuttle bus will leave Ponca at **8:15** sharp. During the colder weather, students will be able to board the bus as soon as they arrive. We will attempt to have the bus running and warmed up for comfort and safety. It is important that the bus leaves Ponca at **8:15** in order to get students to Jackson Elementary for the start of their school day, which begins at **8:40**.



Vacation for the Christmas and New Year's Holiday Season will begin Friday, December 19th at 3:30 p.m. School will reconvene on Monday, January 5, 2009.

BOARD GOALS - 2009

In a continued effort to provide a quality education for all students of the Ponca Public School District, the Board of Education will annually assess the goals and objectives that provide guidance for the District. Recently, the Board met with a facilitator from the Nebraska Association of School Boards to develop goal statements for the 2009 year. After reviewing and discussing many such issues and topics of relevance to the District, four (4) goal statements were developed and approved by the Board. Action plans to accomplish these goals have been established as well as assignment to individuals to be in charge of the process.

GOAL #1: The Board will direct a committee of school administrators, students, faculty, community members alumni to address the school mascot issue. A recommendation will be provided to the Board for a final decision.

GOAL #2: The Board will actively explore cooperative agreements with neighboring school districts to share personnel, programs, or services.

GOAL #3: The Board will, and administrators will, identify opportunities to expand the Board's working knowledge and understanding of the District curriculum and instruction.

GOAL #4: A Study of procedures, protocol, and process will begin to address learning facility needs district-wide.

Jackson Elementary News

Where did November go? It seems like yesterday we were preparing for Thanksgiving and now Christmas! It is a great time of year.

We are very excited about our upcoming Christmas program on December 5th at 7:00pm. Mrs. Lamprecht always has an outstanding program. **The program will be in the Ponca Gymnasium instead of the Jackson Gymnasium.** We've moved the program to Ponca to better handle the anticipated sellout crowd.

With the winter season upon us, we are asking parents to make sure their children have the following items with them at school: **boots, hat, coat, and gloves.** The students go outside for recess on most days and these items are essential.

With the winter weather being unpredictable a big concern is school cancellation, early dismissal, and late starts. We will make every effort to make a decision as early as possible. We will try to make decisions on late starts and cancellations by 7:00am. The announcement will be broadcast on the Sioux City television and radio stations. Please have emergency arrangements made in case of an early dismissal. The early dismissal will be announced in the same manner as a cancellation. Please remember an early dismissal means conditions are dangerous. We need to get students and staff out of the building and home as fast as possible. If your emergency plan is different than the usual pickup procedure, please notify the school.

We have a concern with the food students eat at lunch. According to state standards students are required to eat 3 of the 5 items. The 5 items at lunch are meat, vegetable, fruit, bread, and milk. Sometimes these items are in a combination. The problem arises when students choose milk, cookie, and bread. The same problem happens with cold lunch. They really aren't eating very well. Please talk to your child about eating habits and what they should eat.

We are having a problem with students being tardy for school and to the shuttle bus. This causes a distraction and a delay in getting the day started. Please remember the school day at Jackson Elementary starts at 8:40 sharp and the shuttle bus leaves at 8:15 sharp. Please help us teach responsibility and punctuality.





BACK TO SCHOOL TIME TO CHECK FOR HEAD LICE

ow that school has started, parents are encouraged to check for head lice as part of their families regular routine. Families should make checking for lice as basic an activity as brushing their teeth or washing their hands. Head lice are common among elementary school students because young children have a lot of contact with their classmates.

Lice are reddish-brown wingless insects; lice eggs, or nits, are grayish-white, always oval shaped and are attached at an angle to the side of the hair shaft.

Products over the counter can be purchased to control the lice. If it continues to be a problem, you should see your physician.

Some tips in combating head lice are:

- *Check children and watch for signs of head lice, such as frequent head scratching
- *Remove all nits with a comb or fingernails to assure total lice treatment
- *Use a medicated shampoo, lotion or cream rinse, but remember that all lice-killing products are pesticides and label directions should be followed.
- *Check with your physician before using lice treatment pesticides if the child has allergies, asthma or epilepsy.
- *Wash bedding and clothing in hot water and dry in a hot dryer.
- *Articles that cannot be washed can be vacuumed or placed into a plastic bag and sealed for two weeks to kill all lice and nits.


