


From the Superintendent's Desk...

SCHOOL MAKE-UP DAYS - Due to the unusual winter that we have just experienced, the Ponca School District had to cancel six (6) days of classes due to weather. In addition, there were two (2) other school days where classes were cancelled. Add to this the instructional hours missed due to the heat schedule at the beginning of the year, and other late starts/early dismissals, a total of ninety-three (93) hours of instructional time has been missed. Each school district in our state must meet certain standards, in terms of instructional hours, to meet state standards. Elementary students must meet 1,032 hours, and secondary students need 1,080 hours of instruction.

In order to make up some of these hours of instruction, the Ponca School Board has acted in accordance with my recommendation to lengthen the school year for students. The last day for school attendance for this current school year will be **Wednesday**, **May26th**. This is an extension of five (5) school days.

Kindergarten Round-Up Honor Roll





During the month of April, students in grades 3-8 and 11 will be writing the first Nebraska State Assessment in reading and math It is important that students take these test seriously and do their best work. Each test is given in two 90 minute sessions. Elementary students in grades 3-6 began testing on March 30th. Students in grades 7, 8 and 11 will be writing the tests on April 13, 14, 20, and 21. It is important that students are well rested the night before the assessments and eat a good breakfast. Some tests will be administered in the morning and others in the afternoon depending on the schedule for the grade level

Ponca hosted the Dixon County Health Fair this year. Students from Allen, Newcastle and Wakefield attended afternoon sessions on Teen Dating, STD's and Nutrition and Stress. Students learned how different males and females think as well as signs that might indicate a relationship is not safe. Dr. McCorkindale talked about common STD's and which ones can and cannot be treated. Teens learned the best way to prevent STD's is abstinence. In the session on Nutrition and Stress students learned the importance of eating a balanced diet, regular exercise, and why energy drinks and pop are not healthy choices. Students also had the opportunity to visit several booths in the gym on topics from tobacco education to fitness testing.


The fifth and sixth grade students put on their own Health Fair the morning of the Dixon County Health Fair. They created booths on nutrition, tobacco education, healthy hearts and the body systems. The third and fourth grade students were invited to visit the booths and learn from the fifth and sixth grade students. Throughout the day the students in grades three through six also visited the "Smoke Trailer" and learned about fire prevention and the best way to escape in a fire.

Parents and students are reminded that the school only provides for supervision of athletes at track and golf meets. Therefore a student who is not on the team will only be released from school to attend the event if the student is with a parent or quardian. All students must be pre-excused before 9:00 A.M. to attend or participate in a school activity.

Notes from the principal,

Spring is here which means the end of school is right around the corner. The school year has gone so fast, it seems like yesterday we were preparing for the students to walk in the door.

Kindergarten round-up will be on Wednesday, April 21st. The kindergarten list is in the newsletter; please check the list to make sure your child is registered for kindergarten next year. **Reminder, any child that turns 5 years old before October 15, 2010 is** eligible for kindergarten. If your child is not on the list please contact the office at Jackson as soon as possible.

Pre-school open house is set for Tuesday, April 20th at 6:00pm. The school board has set tuition for next year at \$16.00/day. **Only children 4 years old and not age eligible for kindergarten can attend pre-school**. If you are considering pre-school for your child please plan to attend. The evening is designed to answer any questions you might have about pre-school.

On April 23rd we will be having the annual field day at the athletic field. Jackson Elementary will be attending the elementary field day in Ponca. The field day begins at 1:00pm at the football field. The students will participate in a number of exciting events. Parents are encouraged to attend.

Our spring concerts are April 29th at 7:00pm for the Jackson Elementary students and May 11th at 7:00pm for the Ponca Elementary students. The students have been working hard to make this the best concert ever. Please make plans to attend and see the future stars of American Idol!

Although the weather is getting warmer, students should still be wearing coats to school and recess. We require coats until the temperature gets above 60 degrees.

Throughout the school year students have been practicing fire drills. Again this year we have added tornado drills to our safety program. Students will practice tornado drills during the months of April and May.

This is the time of year when some students seem to slough off with their school work. The weather is nice and because of daylight savings time the day is longer. Summer baseball and soccer are beginning and outdoor activities increase. Please make sure your child does not neglect their school work and continues to get enough sleep. ACT TEST DATE



The next administration of the ACT College Entrance Exam is set for Saturday, April 10, 2010. Any student who has registered for this test date is reminded to take time to prepare for the assessment. ACHIEVEMENT TESTING

During the month of march students at Ponca School participated in Spring Achievement Testing. This year Ponca School is administering the Iowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS) and the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT).

These standardized tests provide school personnel and parents with feedback concerning students' strengths and instructional needs. It provides a framework for evaluation of students' progress as well as evaluation of curriculum strengths and weaknesses.

Elementary students in grades 2-6 and students in grades 7, 8, 9, and 11 participated in these assessments. We are hopeful that testing results will be available before the end of the school year. Watch May's newsletter for further details

CCDC – Character Workshop for Grades 7-12


CCDC to Present to 7-12 Grade Students

The <u>Coalition for Character Development Committee (CCDC)</u> is scheduled to present to students in grades 7-12 on Thursday, April 15, 2010. This is their third presentation in a series of three, that the CCDC team has presented character building programs to our secondary students this year. (*This also happens to be the third year and final year that CCDC will actually present as their grant cycle will be completed.*) Students in grades 7-9 will report to the Auditorium at 8:15 A.M. for this hour long presentation. Then, during 2nd hour students in grades 10-12 will then get to attend the program.

The theme of this presentation is: <u>Life Principals: "The Golden Budda"</u> CCDC team members will share the story of a statue of Budda that was found in Thailand centuries ago. Originally, it was thought that the statue was made of plaster. Scientists discovered that the statue was actually made of gold. The moral of this story will build on three guidelines for a healthy life:

1. Treat yourself and others like they have value.

(Respecting yourself and others for the people they are versus superfacial things that society may deem important.)



(Decisions you make today help determine what your future will be like.)

3. Quit Your Whining.

(You will have rules and boundaries the rest of your life. They are in place for your safety and protection.)

Summer Driver Education Sign-up: Driver Education classes will be held at Ponca School starting in June after school is out. The cost of the class is \$185.00 for students who are residents of the Ponca school District, and \$250.00, for non-resident students. Residence is determined by domicile of the parent with primary custody. Exact dates of the class will be determined at a later date.

Requirements in order to register to take Driver education for the summer of 2010:

1. Enrollment maximum of thirty (30) students.

- 2. Class sign up sheet located in the High School Principal's Office. Sign up by May 1st.
- 3. At time of enrollment, must pay \$92.50 as deposit for taking class. Remainder due the first day of class.
- 4. Must be 14 years of age by June 1, 2010.
- 5. Must be eligible for a Learner's Permit.
- 6. Oldest students on sign-up sheet will be given preference to take class.
- 7. Signing up after May 1st, will put your name on the bottom of the list, regardless of age.

Attention Upcoming Kindergarten and 7th Grade Students

Students entering kindergarten and seventh grade in the 2010-2011 school year must meet the following state requirements;

Kindergarten Students:

- 1. A <u>certified birth certificate</u>, the one obtained for a fee from the state your child was born in. Generally it has a raised seal and state identification number on it. They are available over the internet or by going to the courthouse in the county your child was born in.
- 2. A physical exam
- 3. A <u>visual examination</u> within six months prior to the entrance of school. This test needs to include testing for amblyopia (lazy eye), strabismus (misalignment of the eyes), as well as external and internal eye health. Reading the eye chart at the doctors office <u>does not</u> meet state requirements. Some physicians do not do extensive eye exams, so in that case, you will need to make an appointment to see an eye doctor.

<u>Kindergarten shots.</u> There are several vaccines that your child will need prior to entering kindergarten.

7th Graders:

- 1. A physical exam
- 2. A **tetanus booster**, this is a new requirement as of this year. Your child may also need a 2nd varicella. The immunization clinic or Dr.'s office will be able to tell you which vaccines your child is eligible for, but the tetanus booster is required!


**Goldenrod Hills Immunization Clinic is only in Ponca this summer on May 11th and July 13th so please plan accordingly.

***The above state required items need to be handed in by
August 10th for kindergarteners and by the first day of school for
seventh graders. If all items are not handed in by these dates, your
child will be sent home from school on the first day, until we have
the records.



NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY



On Thursday evening, April 22, 2010, 7:00 p.m., new nominees will be recognized and inducted into the Ponca Chapter in a formal National Honor Society Ceremony at Ponca State Park.

Ponca Public School's National Honor Society is a local chapter which is established according to the nationwide National Honor Society organization. National Honor Society was founded in 1921 as an organization which would recognize and encourage academic and citizenship qualities in students. National Honor Society continues its traditions in the 21^{st} century.

Membership in National Honor Society is open to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have a cumulative scholastic average of 85 percent or above and who demonstrate the qualities of service, character, and leadership. Students carrying a scholastic average of 85 or above are invited to an informational meeting to learn more about National Honor Society. Only those students who complete and return an information sheet by the deadline will be considered for nomination in the National Honor Society. A faculty council comprised of five teachers on staff, review and discuss each student's information sheet, attendance and discipline records, and teacher questionnaires. Private ballots are cast by the faculty council, and those students receiving three out of five "yes" votes are then received as members into National Honor Society.

Every spring, students have the opportunity to be nominated for induction into Ponca High School's local National Honor Society chapter. A constitution and selection guidelines were distributed to those eligible 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students who expressed an interest by attending the information meeting on March 9, 2010. In order to be considered for nomination, students returned their completed information sheets to Mr. Gehring by 4:00 p.m. on March 19, 2010.




RECYCLE YOUR HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES!!



Ponca National Honor Society is doing our part to go green and we need your help! We will be recycling old household batteries that would otherwise end up in landfills and harm the environment.



INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES FOR PONCA HIGH SCHOOL'S PROM DANCE & AFTER PROM 2010



Parents: Please make sure your son/daughter has purchased a park sticker prior to the dance date/time!

The purpose of the following information is to familiarize parents, guardians, Ponca students and outside dates with the guidelines and procedures for Ponca High School's Prom and After Prom Party. Our objective is for all of our students and guests to have an enjoyable, drug-free and safe evening.

- 1. A Prom Dance will be held at Ponca State Park Visitors Center on Saturday, April 17th from 8:00 P.M. to 12:00 P.M. for Ponca students in grades 11 through 12 and for their outside dates whose names are registered in the Principal's office by 4:00 P.M. on Friday, April 16th. A Grand March will be held for Seniors and Juniors and their dates at 7:00 P.M. at the Ponca High School Auditorium and everyone is welcome
- 2. The Prom Dance will be chaperoned by the Junior class sponsors, the Principal, and other teachers. A police officer will also be on hand from time to time to check on the Prom Dance. If enough teachers are not available to help sponsor the dance, it may be necessary to ask some parents to help out.
- 3. A Ponca student who has an outside date will be responsible for explaining the rules to their date, and their date will be responsible for following these rules.
- 4. Juniors and Seniors and their dates will be admitted to the Prom Dance free of charge.
- 5. Juniors and Seniors and their dates who attend the Prom Dance are required to wear formal attire or they will not be admitted to the dance. This means a formal or dress for the girls and a tuxedo or suit and tie for the boys. This means no blue jeans, shorts, T-shirts, caps, etc.
- 6. All students who plan to attend the Prom Dance must be at the park by 9:30 P.M. or they will not be permitted to the dance. Any Ponca student or their date that leaves the Prom Dance before it's over, must sign out before they leave the dance and will not be permitted to reenter.
- 7. If a Ponca student or their date practices unacceptable behavior at the Prom Dance, their parents will be called, and the offender will be required to leave with their parents. If a student is told to leave the Prom Dance, they will not be permitted to attend the After-Prom Party.
- 8. Ponca students and their dates attending the Prom Dance will be subject to an alcohol breath test by an off-duty police officer prior to admission to the dance.
- 9. If any Ponca student and/or their date has been drinking or using any form of drug or tobacco, their parents or guardian will be called immediately to come to dance location to be present for a breathalyzer test on their son or daughter and to take them home if they have been drinking or using any form of drug or tobacco. Any student who tests positive for alcohol or drug use will be subject to prosecution by the law as well as being disciplined by the school for violating school rules which apply to the situation.
- 10. As of January 1, 1994 a new zero tolerance law went into effect in Nebraska which basically states that any minor who gets caught driving while they are under the influence of alcohol of any amount, can have their driver's license revoked on the spot for 30 days.
- 11. After-Prom Party will be held at Harmony Lanes in South Sioux City, Nebraska from 1:00 A.M. to 5:00 A.M. for students in grades 11-12 and their dates. Students must arrive & be breathalyzed at the door by 1:00 A.M. A student may attend the After-Prom Party even if he or she does not attend the Prom Dance. All students who plan to attend the After-Prom Party must register and pay \$5.00 per person in the Guidance Office with Nancy Walsh by 4:00 P.M. on April 16th.
- 12. Students who plan to attend the After-Prom Party will be given one hour to change clothes and drive to Harmony Lanes in South Sioux City, Nebraska.
- 13. If a student is registered to attend the After-Prom Party, and they do not show, their parents will be notified to let them know that their son or daughter did not arrive.
- 14. Any student who leaves will NOT be allowed to return, and parents will be contacted.
- 15. Every student entering Harmony Lanes will be breathalyzed at the door. They will be subject to the same rules, procedures, and prosecution as a person attending the Prom Dance in case of drug, alcohol, or tobacco use or unacceptable behavior.

Attention Juniors, Seniors, and Parents.... After-Prom 2010!!!!!

The Ponca After-Prom date is approaching quickly!!! This event will be held at Harmony Lanes in South Sioux City. The deadline to register is Friday, April 16th with a \$5.00 charge per student.
