### VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO PARENTS!!! NEW VACCINE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE NEXT SCHOOL YEAR (2011-2012)!

Starting next fall (August 2011), all Nebraska students in grades K-12 are required by law to have 2 doses of varicella (chicken pox) vaccine <u>OR</u> written proof of having had the chicken pox disease.

Please schedule an appointment with your physician or your local immunization clinic as soon as possible to vaccinate your child if they don't meet these requirements. Please send proof of vaccination to the school, as <u>students will not be able to start school in the fall if they</u> <u>don't meet Nebraska state immunization guidelines.</u> If you have any questions, please notify Mrs. Herfel at Ponca Public School.



Have your child Spot The Block at fast-food restaurants. Many fast-food restaurants offer a number of types and sizes of foods, and using the Nutrition Facts Label at fast-food restaurants is a great way to show kids the importance of their dietary choices.

### Spot The Block Before You Go

Your child can check out the nutrition information on some restaurants' Websites before going there to eat. This is a great chance to have your kids discover nutrition facts about the foods they like and decide what to order in advance. Remind them to consider the calories and choose nutrients wisely while selecting their foods.



### **Check Out the Nutrition Information**

Have your child find the nutrition information at the restaurant, and if it's not posted, he or she can ask to see it. Obtaining the nutritional information about the restaurant's food is the first step towards making informed choices about what to order.



### **Compare Different Foods and Meal Sizes**

Have your kids Spot The Block to see the differences in nutrients between various items. Compare different ways foods are prepared, like grilled chicken vs. fried chicken. baked potatoes vs. French fries . . . and compare small vs. large portions. Remember that a super-sized item will contain a higher amount of nutrients than a standard-sized item, because the serving size is larger!



### Substitute One Item

Ask your child to compare different food items using the Nutrition Facts Label. He or she can see which foods are lower in nutrients to get less of. Challenge your child to replace one high-fat or high-calorie item he or she would have ordered with one that has lower calories or fat. Or, encourage your child to choose a food with lower sodium content.



### NOTICE TO PARENTS OF PONCA SCHOOL PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING ENROLLMENT OPTIONS FOR THE 2011 – 2012 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents or guardians considering the use of the enrollment options program to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the state of Nebraska should be aware of the following date:

March 15, 2011 - Deadline for filing enrollment option application for the 2011-2012 school year unless a waiver of dates is granted.

Limitation - The enrollment option shall be available only once to each student prior to graduation unless:

- (a) the student relocates in a different resident school district,
- (b) the option school district merges with another district.

**Eligibility** – Eligibility will be considered for transfer students who have transferred from one school to another when there is not a change of domicile by the parents. Those students who have their transfer papers signed and filed on or before **March 15** shall be eligible immediately in the fall. Those students who do not have their transfer applications signed and filed on or before **March 15** shall be ineligible for 90 school days.

Transportation – The parents of the optioned student shall be responsible for required transportation to the option district.
