An article entitled *Homework* was attached to your elementary child's report card recently. I sincerely hope that you took the time to read the article. Homework is an important tool in a student's life as it teaches responsibility, independent work habits, organization, and time management. If problems arise at home concerning the amount of time it takes your child to complete the homework or not understanding the assignment, it may be due to the fact that the student may not be using their time wisely at school. Students are given the opportunity to complete work at school during study time, during recess, and before or after school when teachers are available. As the twelfth tip in the article stated, most children adopt the value of their parents. Show your children that you value learning by doing educational activities such as reading, discussing current events, or going to the library.

NOTICE TO PARENTS OF PONCA SCHOOL PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING ENROLLMENT OPTION FOR THE 2014 – 2015 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents or guardians considering the use of the enrollment options program to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the state of Nebraska should be aware of the following date:

March 15, 2014 - Deadline for filing enrollment option application for the 2014-2015 school year unless a waiver of dates is granted.

Limitation - The enrollment option shall be available only once to each student prior to graduation unless:

- (a) the student relocates in a different resident school district,
- (b) the option school district merges with another district.

Eligibility – Eligibility will be considered for transfer students who have transferred from one school to another when there is not a change of domicile by the parents. Those students who have their transfer papers signed and filed on or before March 15 shall be eligible immediately in the fall. Those students who do not have their transfer applications signed and filed on or before March 15 shall be ineligible for 90 school days.

Transportation – The parents of the optioned student shall be responsible for required transportation to the option district.

What are our teachers doing during those monthly Wednesday's when students are dismissed early? Our teachers are working in Professional Learning Communities commonly referred to as PLCs. Teachers are grouped into PLCs based on the task they are assigned for that day. Recently the focus of our PLCs has been to explore ways to improve student assessment results. Our teachers have been trained to evaluate student MAP and NeSA data. Areas of concern are identified and plans are written and put in place to help all students improve. We have teacher teams at the elementary and secondary levels that are also exploring ways to motivate our students to perform their best on assessments. All of our teachers are working hard to improve learning for Ponca School students!

February 4th is the middle of our third quarter. Midterm Reports will be processed and given to students on February 5. Your child is required to return the Midterm Report to the school with a parent signature. Remember to talk with your child about their midterm report.

Parent/Teacher conferences are scheduled from 2:00-8:00 p.m. on February 13. This is a great opportunity to collaborate with your child's teachers. Please make time in your schedule for Parent/Teacher conferences.

Mark your calendar for the Ponca School Spelling Bee on February 20, at 2:00 p.m. Students in grades 5-8 who scored the highest on the classroom written spelling test will compete in our local Spelling Bee. The top five spellers will travel to the Dixon County Spelling Bee on February 27, at 1:00 p.m. at the Haskell Ag Lab near Concord, NE. NEWS FROM THE PONCA PUBLIC SCHOOLS CRISIS TEAM:

We often do not want to think of our school in crisis; however, it is important that we are ready if the time should arise. The Ponca Public School District has a crisis response plan and a crisis response team that has been trained by a Lincoln, NE native, Dr. John Dudley. Ponca's Crisis Team has worked with our staff over the years to prepare for and to respond to a variety of crisis situations. Since the tragedy at Newton, Connecticut, crisis response training has been modified. John Dudley spent time updating Ponca School's Crisis Team during the summer of 2013 in an effort to continue to improve our response time and actions to protect our children.

The purpose of a crisis response team is to provide the most efficient plan to keep our children safe in as normal of a routine as possible. When a crisis strikes there is nothing normal about it. Because of the numerous situations that can pose a crisis, the Ponca Crisis Response Plan addresses the following scenarios (yet not limited to:):

- Tornado Drills
- Lockdown Drills Medical, Chemical, Intruder in the Building, Threat in the Area
- Evacuation Drills Fire, Intruder in the Building, Chemical

The purpose of this information is to inform our parents and community members of how we implement our response plans and how we will prepare our students and staff to actually practice these drills. Part of the new training will educate our students and parents with the basic steps of the school district's crisis response in a variety of circumstances. A letter will be sent home to parents/guardians outlining the procedures that the school will follow in these situations. The letter will also outline the steps the parents/guardians need to follow.

We will begin by having a series of assemblies (for students in grades: PK-2, 3-6, 7-12) to explain the appropriate responses to a variety of crisis situations mentioned above. For example:

In the case of an evacuation, off site locations have been identified. Once we are at those sites, students will be allowed to use their cell phones to contact parents. There will also be a reunification site identified where parents (emergency contacts) can pick up their child/children. At this site the guardian(s) picking up the student(s) will be required to show a picture ID.

Once the weather is warmer, we will practice each of these drills that require us to move to the designated evacuation sites.

The purpose of these drills is not to scare anyone, but to educate and properly prepare students and staff. One fact we learned from our training is that it is impossible to handle every crisis perfectly. Our hope is that when crisis strikes, we can handle it to the best of our ability with the full support of our parents/guardians as to why certain procedures are followed in crisis response. If you have any questions or want to learn more about our Crisis Team and the services it provides, please feel free to visit with any of our members.

<u>With regards to John Dudley School Crisis Response Training</u>: Dr. Dudley's crisis team training is known worldwide. He and his crisis teams have responded not only locally, but nationally, including the crisis situations in: Oklahoma City, OK; Columbine, CO; Paduca, KY; and Newton, CN; to name a few. The majority of the schools in Northeast Nebraska have been trained using Dr. Dudley's crisis response plan.



NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY



Ponca Public School's National Honor Society is a local chapter which is established according to the nationwide National Honor Society organization. National Honor Society was founded in 1921 as an organization which would recognize and encourage academic and citizenship qualities in students. National Honor Society continues its traditions in the 21st century.

Membership in National Honor Society is open to sophomores, juniors, and seniors who have a cumulative scholastic average of 85 percent or above and who demonstrate the qualities of service, character, and leadership. Students carrying a scholastic average of 85 or above are invited to an informational meeting to learn more about National Honor Society. Only those students who complete and return an information sheet by the deadline will be considered for nomination in the National Honor Society. A faculty council comprised of five teachers review and discuss each student's information sheet, attendance and discipline records, and teacher questionnaires. Private ballots are cast by the faculty council, and those students receiving three out of five "yes" votes are then received as members into National Honor Society.

Every third quarter, students have the opportunity to be nominated for induction into Ponca High School's local National Honor Society chapter. Selection guidelines and expectations will be presented to those eligible 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students in an informational meeting on Thursday, February 6th. In order to be considered for nomination, students must return their completed information sheets to Mrs. Foulks by 4:00 p.m. on Monday, February 24th, 2014. 





got your dairy today?

10 tips to help you eat and drink more fat-free or low-fat dairy foods



The Dairy Group includes milk, yogurt, cheese, and fortified soymilk. They provide calcium, vitamin D, potassium, protein, and other nutrients needed for good health throughout life. Choices should be low-fat or fat-free—to cut calories and saturated fat. How much is needed? Older children, teens, and adults need 3 cups* a day, while children 4 to 8 years old need 2½ cups, and children 2 to 3 years old need 2 cups.

"skim" the fat
Drink fat-free (skim) or low-fat (1%) milk. If you currently
drink whole milk, gradually switch to lower fat versions.
This change cuts calories but doesn't reduce calcium or other
essential nutrients.

boost potassium and vitamin D, and cut sodium
Choose fat-free or low-fat milk or yogurt more often than cheese. Milk and yogurt have more potassium and less sodium than most cheeses. Also, almost all milk and many yogurts are fortified with vitamin D.

ingredient switches
When recipes such as dips call for sour cream, substitute plain yogurt. Use fat-free evaporated milk instead of cream, and try ricotta cheese as a substitute for cream cheese.

choose sweet dairy foods with care
Flavored milks, fruit yogurts, frozen yogurt, and
puddings can contain a lot of added sugars. These
added sugars are empty calories. You need the nutrients
in dairy foods—not these empty calories.

caffeinating?

If so, get your calcium along with your morning caffeine boost. Make or order coffee, a latte, or cappuccino with fat-free or low-fat milk.

can't drink milk?

If you are lactose intolerant, try lactose-free milk, drink smaller amounts of milk at a time, or try soymilk (soy beverage). Check the Nutrition Facts label to be sure your soymilk has about 300 mg of calcium. Calcium in some leafy greens is well absorbed, but eating several cups each day to meet calcium needs may be unrealistic.

take care of yourself and your family Parents who drink milk and eat dairy foods show their kids that it is important. Dairy foods are especially important to build the growing bones of kids and teens. Routinely include low-fat or fat-free dairy foods with meals and snacks—for everyone's benefit.



top off your meals



Use fat-free or low-fat milk on cereal and oatmeal. Top fruit salads and baked potatoes with low-fat yogurt instead of higher fat toppings such as sour cream.

choose cheeses with less fat
Many cheeses are high in saturated fat. Look for
"reduced-fat" or "low-fat" on the label. Try different
brands or types to find the one that you like.

What about cream cheese?

Regular cream cheese, cream, and butter are not part of the dairy food group. They are high in saturated fat and have little or no calcium.

* What counts as a cup in the Dairy Group? 1 cup of milk or yogurt, 1½ ounces of natural cheese, or 2 ounces of processed cheese.
