### <u>Information from Joan M. Reznicek, Superintendent of Schools</u>

Welcome back to the 2016-2017 school year. Thank you to the patrons of the Ponca School District for your commitment and support to a quality education at Ponca Public Schools. We appreciate your continued support of our school district and most importantly our students.

Do you know that Ponca Public School could get additional <u>REDUCED</u> rates on our long distance telephone charges? Do you know that Ponca Public School could receive <u>FREE</u> grant money from the State of Nebraska and the Federal Government to purchase equipment and supplies for our school? How can this happen? Put in an application for <u>free or reduced lunches</u>. Yes, <u>our school could benefit financially by having more families or individuals apply for free or reduced lunches</u>. All information is kept strictly confidential. Each student enters their own lunch number into the lunch computer confidentially. If you have not filled out your application, please fill out the form. If you need an additional lunch form from the school, please give us a call and we will gladly send one out to you.

We have had several families this school year that have not yet applied for **free or reduced lunches**. Please don't wait for the last minute to get your application into the school to see if you qualify for the free or reduced lunches. If you qualified last year, yes, you have approximately one month on this new school year to continue on the 2015-2016 status. But, when the one month time period has expired, you will be paying full price for lunches. The school district cannot continue to give the free or reduced lunch price.

#### PLEASE APPLY FOR FREE OR REDUCED LUNCHES!!

All visitors are required to check in at the high school office. Visitors will be required to sign in at the High School Principal's Office, leave their car keys, and then will be given a visitor pass to wear while in the building. If a parent arrives at school to get their child due to sickness or an appointment, the parent will wait in the high school office for school personnel to get their child from his/her classroom. We understand that many of our parents have gone to the classrooms in previous years to get your child, but we are trying to cut down on the classroom distractions plus we always want our students and staff to be safe.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation in keeping our school safe.

## UPDATES FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL

**IMPORTANT MAILING!** Parents please watch for an important mailing from Ponca School. In September you will be receiving a mailing that includes the Nebraska State Accountability (NeSA) test scores in reading and math for students in grades 3-8 and 11. If your child was in grade 5, 8 or 11 last year you will also see a NeSA score for your child in science. These scores are from the NeSA tests administered to your child last spring. This mailing will also include the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) scores for your child.

**ANOTHER IMPORTANT MAILING!** If you did not attend the elementary or secondary "Parents Night at School" you will also find in your mailbox a form to verify your child's information and update the school message system information. Please update the "Student/Parent Information Sheet" and return it to the school. It is important that the school has the correct information for your child.

HELP KEEP OUR SPORTING EVENTS SAFE! Because the school is concerned with the safety and welfare of our students and spectators at school events, we will not allow children of any age to play unorganized football and group games in the open areas surrounding the football fields at home or away events. Parents please supervise your children and do not allow them to bring footballs and other sports balls to football games. Thank-you for helping to keep our sporting events safe for people of all ages!

#### STUDENT/PARENT HANDBOOK REMINDER

Printed copies of the "Ponca School Student/Parent Handbook" are available in the school office for people who do not have online access to it or simply prefer a printed copy.

#### MAP TESTING

Each year students in grades K-11 take the MAP test in the fall and spring. Elementary students are also tested in the winter. MAP is the acronym for Measure of Academic Progress. MAP is an "adaptive" measure of the learning needs of every student. At the completion of the test students receive immediate feedback on their results. Teachers use the information from MAP throughout the school year to plan learning for the students in their classrooms. Students in each grade level are assessed in reading, math, language arts, and science. Administering the fall MAP test at the beginning of the school year gives teachers the opportunity to find out early the learning needs of each student and gives students information on areas they need to focus on to grow their own learning.

**SENIORS AND SOPHOMORES TO MEET WITH JOSTENS!** The Jostens Ring and Announcement Company will be at school on Wednesday, September 14, to present their products to seniors and sophomores. The senior meeting will begin at 11:00 a.m. with information about announcements and graduation products. They will meet with the sophomores about class rings at 12:09 p.m. Senior and sophomore parents are welcome to attend the meetings. Stop in the Principal's office so we can give you a visitor's pass and direct you to the room in which the class is meeting.

FIRST QUARTER MIDTERM REPORTS! Before the end of September, "Midterm Reports" for the first quarter will be processed. Students will receive the reports on Friday, September 16. Parents are asked to review and sign their child's report. In order to participate in or attend school activities, students are required to return the signed report to the school by Wednesday, September 21. Contact the school if you do not receive your child's midterm report so one may be mailed to you. You can also access your child's grades on PowerSchool, the student management system. Contact the school if you need your web login and password.

#### 7-12 PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES!

Mark your September calendar for Parent/Teacher conferences on Thursday, September 22. Conferences are scheduled for 2:00 – 8:00 p.m. The conference time is for you to learn about your child's progress in school and for the teacher to learn from you about their child. Although grades are important, they are only a piece of data. Good parent-teacher conferences focus on learning and how the child can grow and improve. Teachers like parents want each child to succeed. Be prepared to ask questions or talk about ways you and the teacher can help your child.

The Ponca Public School requests your help in locating handicapped children. The school implements the Federal Handicapped Children's Act (PL 94-142) and Nebraska statute, which guarantees a free appropriate educational program for all children between birth and 21 years of age. If you have students or know of any young person who meets these criteria, please contact Superintendent's office.

Picture packets will be sent home prior to picture day. **ALL** students will have their pictures taken for the yearbook.



## PONCA ELEMENTARY NEWS

The school year is off and running! We had a very good start and everyone is settling into a routine. The first two weeks have been smooth; I hope this is an indication of how the whole year will be.

Elementary students will be taking the fall MAP tests the week of Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>. These are very important tests to help us measure growth and compare how we are doing academically. Results of the MAPS Tests will be with your child's report card in October. Parents can help by making sure your children get plenty of rest and eat a good breakfast before coming to school.

Speaking of rest, there was an article in the Sioux City Journal in early July that addressed the guidelines for the amount of sleep children should receive. The article prescribed children from ages 6 to 12 should get between 9 to 12 hours of sleep each night. The article went on to say children that do not receive the proper amount of sleep can develop health problems such as obesity, depression, and hypertension. The article recommended all electronic devices be shut off one half hour before a child's bedtime.

The athletic season is getting under way and we anticipate another exciting year. A couple of reminders as we begin the athletic season, if a student goes home ill from school or is absent from school they are not permitted to attend an event that same evening without permission from the administration. Students are expected to sit and watch the event they are attending, not run around. If a student is given a second warning to sit down at an event they will be required to sit with their parents or guardian the remainder of the year. If a parent or guardian is not at the event they will be sent home. Students should not bring footballs or any type of ball to football games. If a student brings a ball to a game it will be confiscated.

The school board is in the process of looking at plans to remodel the playground at Jackson next summer. It is a large undertaking but something that is necessary. In order to help with the cause the elementary staff and students will be having various fundraising efforts throughout the year. We will keep you informed as the year progresses.

If you are dropping off or picking up students, please do not enter the building. For safety reasons it is important that students enter the building on their own. It is fine to walk them to the door but students need to learn to enter the building on their own.

The elementary will attend the Homecoming victory march September 23<sup>rd</sup> @ Ponca. The Jackson students will do their annual dance on Main Street choreographed by Mrs. Lamprecht. The Ponca students will attend the pep rally at the sports complex. Elementary students will not participate in other activities such as dress-up days. Elementary students will be allowed to participate in blue and white day on Friday.





- PRESS BOX AND LOFT: Fans may begin bidding on seating in the press box or the loft above the concession stand for the first home game September 2nd. The press box will seat 10 fans and the loft approximately 20 fans. Bids can be dropped off at the school in a sealed envelope addressed to Bob Hayes or e-mailed to Bob Hayes @ bobhayes@poncaschool.org. Bidding will cease at 12:00 noon September 1<sup>st</sup>. Bidding will be posted on the school web page, the name of the top bid will be kept confidential. You may increase your bid at anytime! The winner will be notified Thursday afternoon September 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Sports Complex Playground: The playground equipment at the sports complex belongs to the City of Ponca and is not regulated by the school. During athletic contests at the sports complex the school is not liable and will not be supervising the equipment. Children using the equipment will be at their own risk and the school will not be responsible for any accidents that may occur.
