Students in grades 3-8 will participate in the NSCAS (Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System) and all Juniors will participate in the ACT test. This is a great opportunity for our students to showcase their progress, skills, and knowledge. It is very important our students take these assessments seriously. Be sure your child gets plenty of sleep the night before tests and a good breakfast.

Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled on Thursday, February 8th from 2:00 to 8:00PM. Dismissal for ALL students will be at 1:10 for the Jackson students and 1:30 for the Ponca students. Please plan on attending your child(ren)'s conferences, as it is a good time to have individualized conversations about academic progress.

I am not normally one to brag. I am short. I am gaining weight at a pace I am not proud. And...I am below average when it comes to how smart I am especially if you were to ask my wife. © Regardless of my own self and my limitations, I do want to brag about some of the amazing programs and people at school.

First of all, EVERY student in grades 2-11 had an individualized conference with a teacher following MAP Growth testing, AND they will have another 1-on-1 conference in the coming weeks. You read that correctly. EVERY single student had a 1-on-1 individualized conference with a teacher to set educational growth goals based on test data. Our teachers are so concerned about the growth of every student at Ponca Public Schools, and they are using the MAP Growth test data to further instruction.

Second, our PLC (Professional Learning Communities) time every Monday is cherished time. In speaking for grades 7-12, our time is not wasted. We are tracking every student and their missing work for the week to ensure that we are focused on every student and their educational needs. Teachers have set SMART (Specific, Measureable, Attainable, Relevant, and Timebound) goals that focus on our school improvement goal of improving literacy for all students. We analyze test data to discuss how we can improve our instruction. And...these are only a sample of the things we are accomplishing as a district.

In speaking of PLC and school improvement, the teachers on each of these teams are or will be leaders in education in our school district and in the state in years to come. The PLC team meets at least 1 time per week to plan our agendas for each Monday. The School Improvement team meets regularly to complete the requirements of the state for school accreditation as well as to create action plans to move our school district forward. I am telling you now, the people on these teams have expertise and skills that are going to make our district thrive for years to come.

Another thing I love about this school and the teachers is the focus on EVERY student both academically and as the whole person. Our character team of teachers also includes some of the top talent in our district, and they meet regularly to plan 2 lessons per month to serve as a "booster shot" to all of our students in grades K-12 in regards to having positive character and treating people with kindness and respect. Every teacher leads a character group. I get to attend every character meeting, and every lesson is powerful in regards to the theme for the year ("Attitude Determines Direction") and in making a difference for each and every student.

I could go on and on about the top notch activity and athletic programs. I could spend time discussing all of the technology we have available. Our food and maintenance staff are some of the best in the business. They even wear matching shirts every day of the week, and the shirts are so fun. Our substitute teachers could be regular teachers, but they choose to continue to help in our district as substitutes. The PCEF gave scholarships to EVERY senior who applied last year. I consider myself a lucky person to get to be a part of the community and school of Ponca. On second thought, I do have a lot of reasons to brag...as long as we do not talk about me.

7-12 QUARTER 3 MIDTERM REPORTS will be given to parents on February 8, at Parent/Teacher Conferences. Students whose parents do not attend conferences will be given their Midterm Reports on Friday, February 9, to bring home. If you do not attend conferences, be sure to ask your 7-12 child to see his/her Midterm Report.

IT IS SPELLING BEE TIME FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES 5-8! Wednesday, January 31, students in grades 5-8 will be administered a 25-word written test. The students who earn the top spelling scores on the Ponca Schools written Spelling Bee test will advance to the oral spelling bee. Ponca Schools Oral Spelling Bee is scheduled for Wednesday, February 7, at 2:00 p.m. in the Fine Arts center. The top five spellers will then advance to the Dixon County Spelling Bee held at Allen Consolidated Schools at 1:30 p.m. on February 13, 2018. The public is invited to attend both the Ponca Schools and Dixon County Spelling Bees. If you have a speller in the family you may access the "2017 Spell It" at www.myspellit.com.

REMINDER TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS . . . Even though February is full of winter activities, spring activity practices are scheduled to begin on Monday, February 26. Parents and students are reminded that the district only provides for supervision of athletes or participants at school activities scheduled during the school day. A student who is not on the team, will only be released from school to attend the activity if the student is with his/her parent or guardian. All students must be pre-excused before 9:00 A.M. the day of the event to attend or participate in a school activity.

ACT TEST FOR ALL 11th GRADE STUDENTS...The state of Nebraska has mandated that every 11th grade student in the state of Nebraska should take the ACT test. The ACT test is the main examination that 2- and 4- year colleges and universities in the Midwest use to determine acceptance as well as scholarship money at their institutions. This year, EVERY 11th grade student will be taking the ACT on Wednesday, April 4 at Ponca Public School. The state will be paying for this test, so it is free to your student(s) (generally a \$46 test). The ACT has 4 sections including English, Math, Reading, and Science, and the state of Nebraska has also made it a requirement for students to participate in the writing portion of the test. Certain accommodations are available for students with an IEP or 504, and they must be approved by ACT. There are some free resources available to our 11th grade students in preparing for this test which will be shared with them including ACT Online Test Prep (practice tests) and OnToCollege (direct instruction and immediate feedback on ACT testing). In addition, all 11th grade students will be participating in a 6-8 week program named OnToCollege (formerly John Baylor Test Prep) during school hours to prepare them for the ACT exam. All students will have access to these free online resources at home, so please feel free to take advantage of all these materials.

NEW STATE TEST...This year <u>all 3rd-8th grade students</u> will be required to participate in the NSCAS (Nebraska Student-Centered Accountability System) Summative test on <u>April 17-19.</u> Last year, the state of Nebraska created an entirely new test called English Language Arts in which 50.8% of 3rd-8th grade students in Nebraska were considered proficient in the state. This year, the state of Nebraska is using an entirely different company to administer the summative test. The name of the company is NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association) for the state summative test. We currently use this company for administering the MAP Growth assessment 2-3 times per year for our K-11 students. However, the NSCAS summative test is not associated with the MAP Growth assessment, so comparisons between the tests will not be consistent. Certain accommodations are available for students with an IEP or 504. More information will be available as we near testing time.


*Pre-School open house will be Tuesday, March 27th at 6:00pm at Jackson Elementary.

NOTICE TO PARENTS OF PONCA SCHOOL PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT STUDENTS WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING ENROLLMENT OPTION FOR THE 2018 – 2019 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents or guardians considering the use of the enrollment options program to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the state of Nebraska should be aware of the following date:

March 15, 2018 – The Nebraska Department of Education deadline for filing enrollment option application for the 2018-2019 school year unless a waiver of dates is granted. (If the enrollment option application is filed before March 15th, 2018, the application does not need to be taken to the school the student is leaving.

Limitation - The enrollment option shall be available only once to each student prior to graduation unless:

- (a) the student relocates in a different resident school district,
- (b) the option school district merges with another district.

Eligibility – Eligibility will be considered for transfer students who have transferred from one school to another when there is not a change of domicile by the parents. Those students who have their transfer papers signed and filed on or before March 15 shall be eligible immediately in the fall. According to Nebraska School Activities Assocation, those students who do not have their transfer applications signed and filed on or before May 1 shall be ineligible for 90 school days.

Transportation – The parents of the optioned student shall be responsible for required transportation to the option district.
